

Pre-Nursing Worksheet for Students Entering Fall 2025

(MEETING THESE MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS DOES NOT GUARANTEE ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM)

I. Admission Requirements:

- A. High School graduate or high school equivalency (GED/HiSET/TASC) – official transcript **MUST** be on file (**foreign transcripts must be evaluated by ECE/WES or any NACES accredited foreign credential agency and contain the statement “has the equivalent of a US high school diploma”**).
- B. All applicants **MUST** take the ATI TEAS exam: **Applicants must test only on designated ATI TEAS exam dates** (see Nursing Application packet for a list of exam dates). Applicants are allowed one test attempt per application cycle. Official scores may be transferred in from another institution. All scores will be valid for 2 years from date of administration. To be considered, you need a minimum composite score of 60% **as well as** 60% minimum per section. The exam consists of English and Language Usage, Math, Reading and Science.
- C. Complete 10 semester hours of college credit: BIO 203 (4), PSY 101 (3), ENG 101 (3). Must be completed with a minimum grade of “C” by the end of the Spring 2025 semester.
- D. All applicants **MUST** attend a Mandatory Nursing Information Session during the current application cycle. **Prior year attendance DOES NOT count** (see Nursing Application for a list of dates).

II. Special Notes:

- A. **Current CPR certification must be completed prior to the start of the Nursing program through the AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION CPR course**. The card **must** read **“BASIC LIFE SUPPORT PROVIDER”** and will be valid for a 2-year period. **Red Cross certification is NOT acceptable**. CPR certification is a program requirement, not an admissions requirement.
- B. Since nursing applications are reviewed in June, all admission requirements must be completed by the end of the spring 2025 semester. The number of students that can be accommodated in this program is limited and can vary based on clinical site availability.

III. General Education Requirements:

Applicants who complete all of these courses increase their chance for admission.

HOWEVER, PLEASE NOTE THAT THE NURSING GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES MUST BE COMPLETED WITH A MINIMUM GPA OF 2.5 FOR ADMISSION CONSIDERATION. ADDITIONALLY, THE MORTON COLLEGE CUMULATIVE GPA MUST BE A MINIMUM OF 2.0. IF THERE IS NO MORTON COLLEGE GPA, GPA WILL BE CALCULATED USING TRANSFER TRANSCRIPTS.

***PREREQUISITE COURSES:** *These courses must be completed by the end of spring 2025 for admission consideration and ranking point calculation. HIGHLY RECOMMENDED for applicants to also complete PEH 103 to increase success in the program (no points awarded for PEH 103).*

Nursing program admission is based on a point ranking system, with the highest ranked applicants admitted to the program. For each of the above completed courses, multiply the grade points earned by the multiplier listed for each course. For example, an A in BIO 203 earns 32 points (4 x 8). The final ranking is the number of points earned through the spring 2025 semester from all of the completed courses listed.

Students will be admitted based on a point ranking system. The following formula will be used to calculate the applicant’s overall point total:

TEAS Score (.5) + TEAS Reading (.1) + TEAS Science (.1) + Course Points (.3) = _____ Total Ranking Score

(Applicants with Bachelor’s Degree or higher will receive 5 bonus points)

Admission Tiers:

Tier 1 - TEAS composite 80%+ - Guaranteed admission if also meeting minimum admission requirements

Tier 2 - TEAS composite 70-79% - admitted based on ranking points

Tier 3 - TEAS composite 60- 69% - conditionally admitted based on ranking points with mandatory remediation

**Note due to space limitations students will be admitted until capacity is reached. Not all ranked students will be admitted.*

- Students are allowed only ONE READMISSION to the Nursing Program after first admission.
- A physical examination is required. Updated immunization(s) may also be required.
- Medical insurance is required prior to starting the Nursing Program.
- TEAS Test exam results will be valid for 2 years from the date of administration. Applicants are allowed one test attempt per application cycle. Applicants are responsible for the TEAS Test exam fee.
- A criminal background check (requiring a Social Security Number) and a 10 panel drug screen will be conducted prior to admission to the Nursing Program.
